Fourth Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioners,

The talk on Newman last week by Fr. Richard Duffield was again excellent. We learnt something about Newman's grasp of reality deriving from his relationship with God (heart speaks to heart) and how from that his whole understanding of the world opened up. An open heart, to God, to reality, to truth—this is what is so important. I have a recording of his talk, so let me know if you would like to borrow it.

Tuesday this week, we have our final talk by Fr. Ian Ker, one of the world's leading experts on Newman. He doesn't normally give talks in ordinary parishes, so we are very privileged to have him coming to speak to us. We are now starting the second half of Lent and so it is time to redouble devotion to Christ and to start preparing for making our confession before Easter. It is not necessary to wait until the service of reconciliation; you can come at any of the advertised times. (i.e. after Mass on most days)

As a General election draws near, the Bishops of England & Wales have published "Choosing the Common Good". It is well worth reading. You can download it from www.catholicchurch.org.uk. Encourage other people, who may not be Catholics, to read it too.

Keep your eyes firmly on the Easter Triduum, those three days in which we celebrate the Passion, Death & Resurrection of Our Lord. These days are the high point of our Catholic observation and commitment.

I pray that you may have a truly blest Holy Week this year.
